CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Over the past several months, we've celebrated with many new Christians as they have showed us their faith in Jesus through baptism. Their testimony has caused many children to ask spiritual questions. Asking questions is a wonderful and appropriate way to gather information as children travel on their spiritual journey to accepting Jesus as Savior.

It's important that we have a personal discussion about the gospel rather than just a presentation of the facts. Here is some general guidance for answering questions children have about faith.

- 1. Of course, pray asking God's Spirit to guide you and the child.
- 2. Remember to ask "open-ended" questions; avoiding those that can be answered with a 'yes or no'. For example, you might say, "Tell me more about what you are thinking.", "What made you ask that question? or "What did you hear or see that makes you ask?"
- 3. Try to give only the information that the child requests; in other words, they are probably not asking to know EVERYTHING that you know. If they want to know more, they will ask. This gathering and processing of facts is a part of building a strong spiritual foundation.
- 4. Don't jump to conclusions. A child may ask, "Why did Andy get baptized?" This question may only be a request for information, not a request for the gospel presentation. A child incorporates concepts and information over time.
- 5. Speak in clear terms. Young children think in concrete terms. Avoid symbolic analogies that may distract from understanding. Rather than saying "ask Jesus into your heart" you could say "become a Christian or invite Jesus into your life to be the boss of your life."

May God bless you as you join your child and other children as they make important steps along their spiritual journey to Jesus.

Dear Church,



A mark of a mature Christian is that we find contentment in any and all circumstances of life. Nowhere is this more evident than in the life of Paul. Whether he was beat, imprisoned, or floating around shipwrecked, he found joy through the journey. Through all the hardships he endured, Paul viewed the circumstances as light momentary affliction (2 Cor. 11:16-18). Beaten with whips, "LIGHT Afflictions", How??

When our oldest son was born my wife had postpartum depression and Reid had acid reflux and colic. One morning at 2:00 a.m. I fed him 2 bottles and he threw them both up and dirtied 4 diapers. He was crying, my wife was crying, and I was crying and wondering why anyone would have kids. I swore that night to never have anymore kids. Within one year Chastity was pregnant with Addison and it was planned. How could my mind have changed that quick? Over the next few months of Reid's life, the joy he brought us, made all the bumps along the way seem so minor in life's perspective.

Paul saw this as he viewed his faith and took the hard-ships as opportunities to proclaim Christ and his goodness. Whatever circumstances life has given you, in a few years when we see our Savior face to face everything else will seem so light. That's why Paul could say "for our momentary light affliction is producing for us an absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory. So we do not focus on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

Pray with me that our focus and joy will be on things of eternal value and not on this corruptible world.
